- 10. A Guide respects herself and others in all she thinks, says and does.

The Guide Journey is a four year programme. Each year the Guides will earn a new Journey badge - Pathfinder, Voyager, Innovator and Trail Blazer.





In Guides there are heaps of opportunities to earn badges for your favourite pastime with lots of badges available! Activities range from camping & watersports to cool crafts and cooking.

There is a huge international dimension to being a Guide, and girls have many opportunities to go on trips abroad to various camps and events. IGG holds an international camp every five years which means that each girl should get the opportunity of attending an international event during their time as a Guide.

The Guiding programme gives the Guides an all round non-formal education and opportunity for self-development.

Guide Units work in a 'Patrol' system. Patrols are led by the Patrol Leader, along with her Assistant Patrol Leader. Leaders and APL's are elected through the Patrol Leaders' Council.
